Aims and Objectives

- To identify trigger questions to complete a general risk assessment as part of the assessment process.
- To develop a person-centred care plan based on the findings of the comprehensive assessment.
- To advise on keeping care plans updated in accordance with each resident's changing needs.
- To discuss conducting reviews as required by the resident's changing needs and on a formal scheduled basis, as required by national regulations and standards.
- To identify the legal and professional requirements for person-centred care planning as described in the HIQA National Standards and Statutory Regulations and the relevant Nursing and Midwifery Board of Ireland guidance.
